Broadband Equity, Access, And Deployment (BEAD) Restructuring Policy Notice

As of June 6th, all Broadband Serviceable Locations (BSLs) have been reset to their Post-Challenge Eligibility Status; additionally, the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) has mandated changes to the subgrantee selection process including an additional subgrantee selection round called the "Bargain Round".

Changes to BEAD Program Requirements

- **Eliminates** multiple sections of requirements
- **Amends** requirements around allowable technologies
- **Adds** new requirements
 - Unlicensed Fixed Wireless (ULFW) 'Mini-Challenge'
 - Benefit of the Bargain Subgrantee Selection Round

Resulting Impact

- North Dakota must rescind all conditional subawards
- All BEAD project areas must be reopened for an additional subgrantee selection application round
- The fiber preference has been removed
- Rubric criteria must focus on minimizing costs
- Non-deployment suspended until further notice

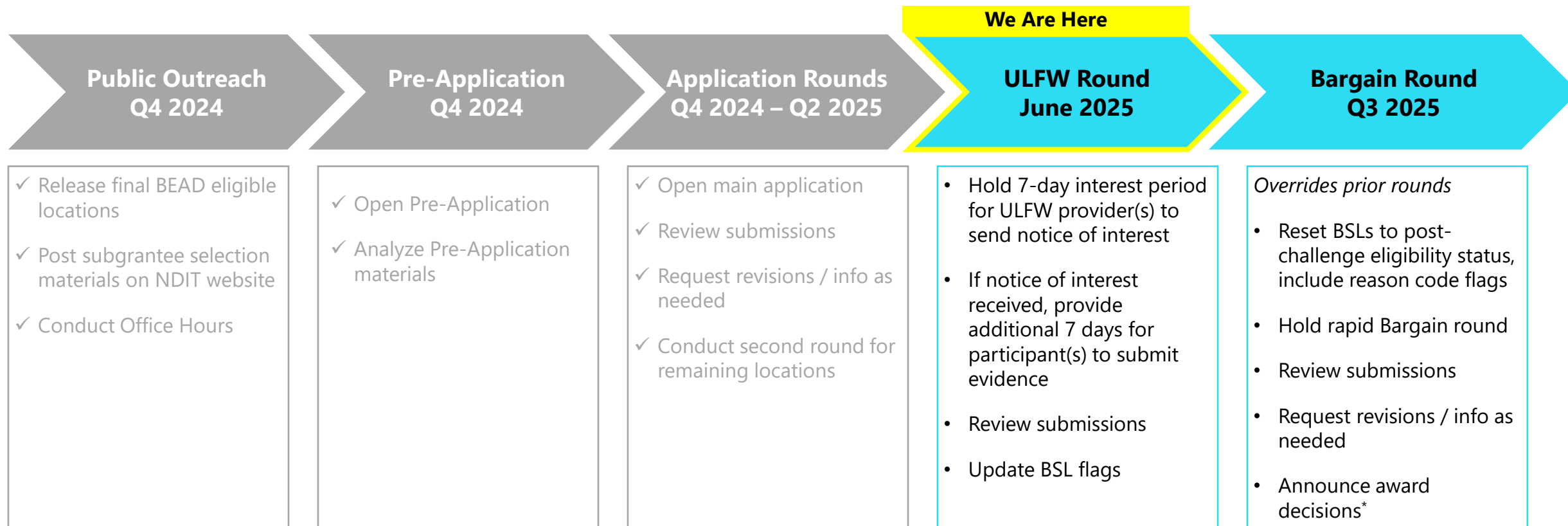

Bargain Round: Early July

Policy Notice | Impacts to Selection Timeline

A mini-challenge is in progress for Unlicensed Fixed Wireless technologies and will end in late June. Following this, a technology neutral “Bargain Round” will occur, which will reset BSLs to their post-challenge service status and incorporate the latest Reason Code flags.



*Final award decisions will not be made and / or announced until all serviceable locations eligible for BEAD funding have received a bid

Policy Notice | Impacts to Application

Requirements / sections struck by the policy notice have been re-classified as optional response – applicants may choose to provide this information if they wish, however it shall not factor into scoring decisions as per the policy notice. **Skipping will not incur a penalty.**

NTIA V3.2 Fabric Data was initially used; challenge process findings were **re-adjudicated using NTIA V4** Fabric Data.

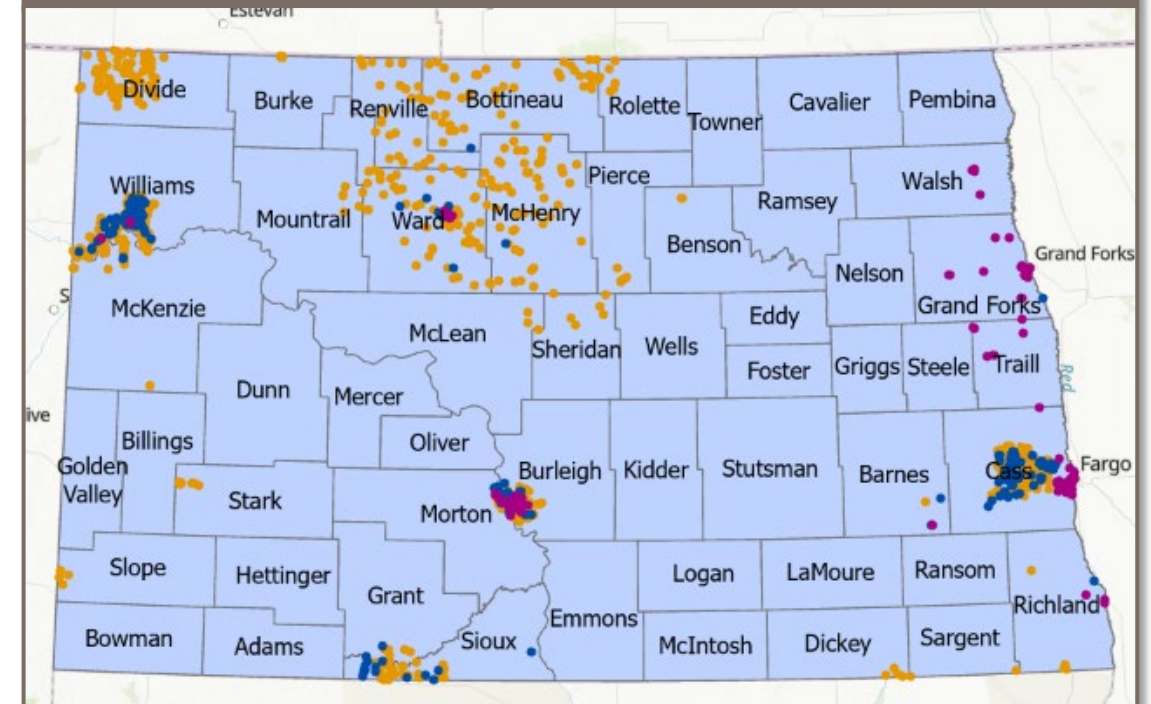

NTIA Tier D License

BEAD applicants must obtain an **NTIA Tier D License from CostQuest**, which will allow ISPs to view the **latitude/longitude** for each location. **To request a license:**

1. **Go to** <https://apps.costquest.com/ntiarequest/>
2. **Confirm** that you have an FRN and contact details for the account
3. **Enter** basic organizational information
4. **Follow** emailed link to input detailed organizational information and information on federal programs
5. **Submit** and follow emailed account creation steps

Policy Notice | Subgrantee Selection Impacts

Internet Service Providers are encouraged to leverage their understanding of their service boundaries to define their own project areas and submit applications for both **Priority Broadband Projects** and **Non-Priority Projects***

New Project Definitions



Priority Broadband Projects: a project that provides broadband service at speeds of no less than 100/20 megabits per second, has a latency ≤ 100 milliseconds; **and can meet** the statutory scalability requirements in 47 U.S.C.§1702(a)(2)(I)(ii).



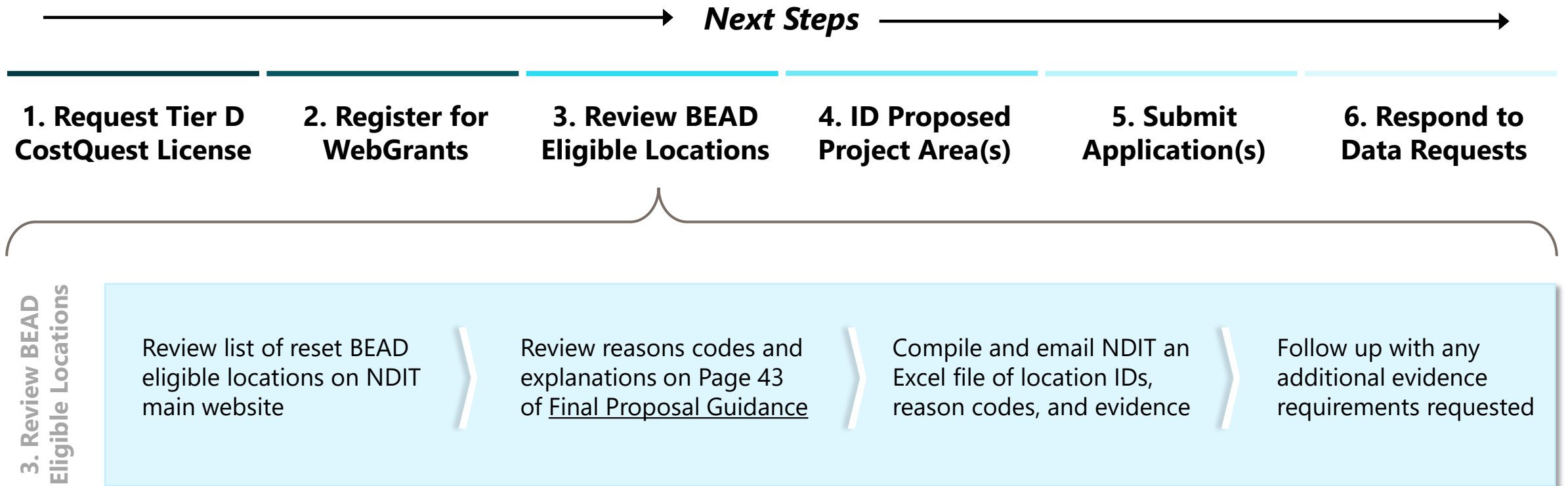
Non-Priority Projects: a project that provides broadband service at speeds of no less than 100/20 megabits per second, has a latency ≤ 100 milliseconds; **but cannot meet** the statutory scalability requirements in 47 U.S.C.§1702(a)(2)(I)(ii).

47 U.S.C.§1702(a)(2)(I)(ii)

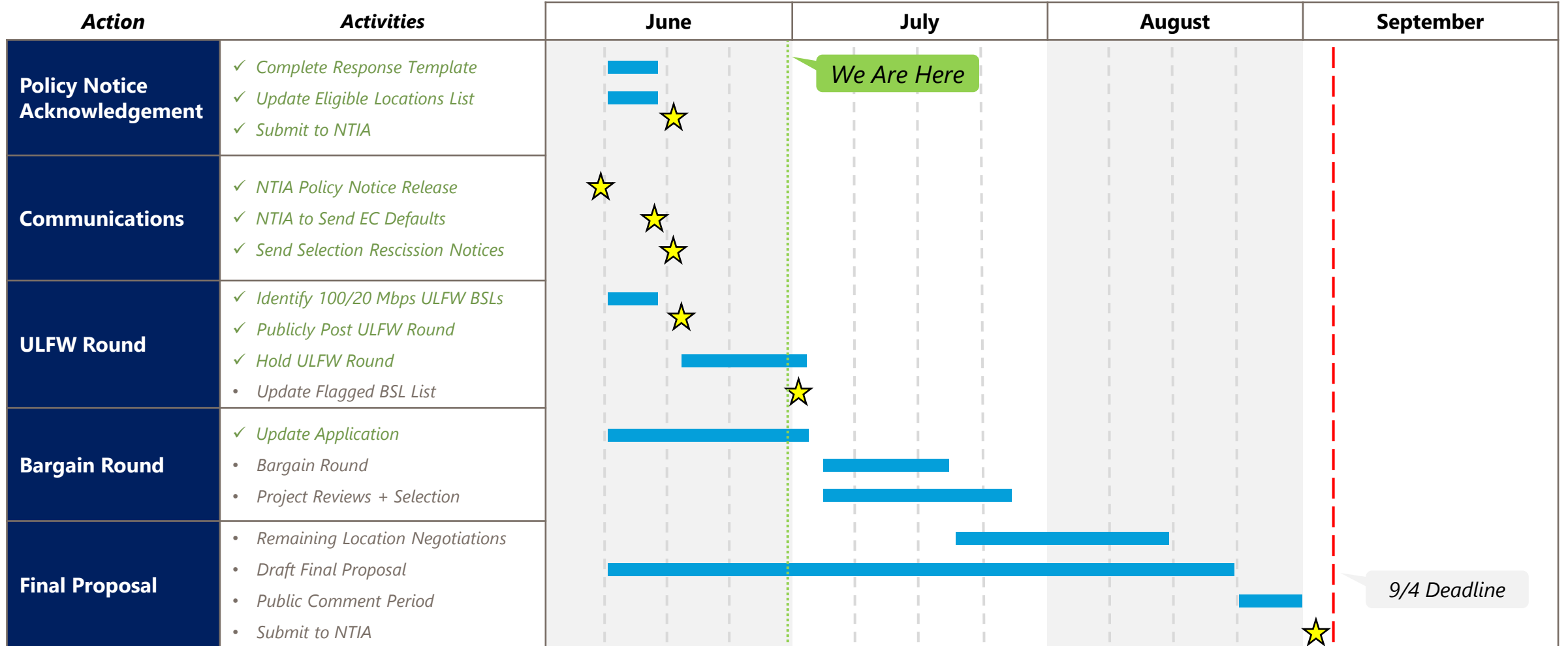
Under statute, projects must:

- i. provide broadband service that meets speed, latency, reliability, consistency in quality of service, and related criteria as the Assistant Secretary shall determine; and
- ii. ensure that the network built by the project can easily scale speeds over time to-
 - I. meet the evolving connectivity needs of households and businesses; and
 - II. support the deployment of 5G, successor wireless technologies, and other advanced services
